iSTOP Legislation Coming Soon, August 27th deadline - from

The New York State Department of Health has begun implementation of the Prescription Monitoring Program Registry — a system designed to curb abuse of prescription controlled drugs. Below are the key facts you must know if you intend to either **prescribe** a Schedule II, III, or IV controlled substance or if you intend to **dispense** any controlled substance in **any** Schedule in **any** quantity.

The Prescription Monitoring Program Registry is one part of the I-STOP (Internet System for Tracking Over-Prescribing) law. The Registry is scheduled by the I-STOP law to take effect on August 27, 2013. Although no regulations have yet been promulgated concerning the Registry, the New York State Department of Health is already taking steps to implement the law as written. If you want to prescribe a Schedule II, III, or IV drug or to dispense any controlled drug in any Schedule, you must be able to access the Registry.

- There is a required duty under the I-STOP law to consult the Registry **before** prescribing any Schedule II, III, or IV drug to a patient. The Registry will contain a minimum of a six month patient controlled substance history and a maximum of a five year history that the prescriber can review. The I-STOP law does allow for a health care professional to designate a person to access and consult the Registry on his or her behalf - but the health care professional always remains legally responsible for the result and conduct of that process by the designee.
- 3. While input to the Registry will be by pharmacists in real time from <u>all</u> the controlled substance prescriptions they fill from any Schedule, there is also a duty for any health care provider who actually dispenses any controlled substance on any Schedule to a patient, in any quantity, to input that drug dispensing information into the Registry. <u>Key</u> prescriptions are input to the Registry only by

- pharmacists, but all health care professionals directly dispensing controlled drugs to patients must input that on their own.
- 4. The NYS Department of Health is sending notices to advise people that access to the Registry will be accomplished through the Health Commerce System (HCS) online account that they already use for renewing and issuing official NYS prescription forms. While many now opt to do renewals via paper, the **only** way the Department of Health will allow access to the Registry is via the HCS online account system.
- 5. If you cannot access the Registry because you didn't sign up for it you will lose the ability to validly prescribe Schedule II, III, or IV controlled substances and the ability to dispense any controlled substance directly to a patient. Your license to practice will also be at risk from the Office of Professional Discipline (OPD) if you attempt to evade or violate the Registry system.



The New York State Dental Association held its Annual Meeting at the Grand Hyatt in New York City from May 31 to June 2 this year. The Fourth District was represented in the NYSDA House of Delegates by the following delegates: Dr. Mark Bauman, Dr. Wayne Harrison, Dr. John McCambley and Dr. Jim Galati. Dr. Maybelle Hwang and Dr. Doug Sandmann served as our Alternate Delegates. Our Executive Director Nancy Hess and NYSDA Trustee Fred Wetzel

The resolutions considered during the House meetings directly affect our members. NYSDA's budget and the dues necessary to fund the state association were a focus throughout the session. The membership's EDPAC

contribution was also a featured item. The debate ultimately resulted in a modest dues increase. The EDPAC contribution will now be 15% of the dues assessment.

The cost of the annual meeting and the size of the recently formed House of Delgates has concerned the officers and trustees. The House decided to study the expenses related to the Annual Meeting and report early next year to the Board of Trustees. Any suggested changes will be ready for the next annual meeting to act upon. Another item being studied is to have a paperless meeting. This may seem like a simple matter, but the cost of providing enough internet bandwidth for our large house and caucus meetings could be significant.

Although our PGY-1 initiative as the pathway to licensure in New York has been successful, the PGY-1 Task Force will study the development of a suitable portfolio-based examination as part of the licensure process. This would be in addition to PGY-1 and would be a review of a candidate's treatment of patients in the dental school setting. Its purpose would be to determine competency and potentially allow ease of licensure outside of New York.

Board Meeting Highlights

March 6, 2013

- MOM event scheduled for June 2014 is on schedule; Dr. Tom Lanka will be Oral Surgeon chair. This is a statewide effort, all Districts as well as large companies will be asked for financial support.
- Dr. Galati The Annual Session committee met in New Orleans; things are going well; booth sales are around 80%, there will be more workshops this year and more C.E. on the floor.
- Dr. Breault \$432,000 has been given to victims of Hurricane Sandy from the NYS Dental Foundation.
- General discussion it may be beneficial to put together an Advisory committee to address issues with the individual county dental societies.

April 10, 2013

- Dr. Baim reported that she has speakers in place for the 2014 SDC and is also considering a hands-on course on dealing with age 1 dental visits.
- It was suggested that we distribute an Evaluation form at the New Dentists and Women Dentists meetings to get feedback and ideas for future meetings.
- Help at the District office- Tina Memos is helping out on an as needed basis one day a week.
- · Adirondack Hygiene Scholarship Fourth District will be sending a check for \$1,000 for selected students.
- \$1,500 was set aside for the Oral Cancer Screening at the Saratoga Race Track.

June 12, 2013

- Nancy Hess has spoken with Carley at NYSDA about setting up online registration for the 4th District C.E. courses and the SDC for next year. Nancy will report progress at the September Board meeting.
- District office summer hours (closed on Fridays) will be in effect until Labor Day.
- Dr. Breault distributed report to the Board on SDC evaluations reviewed individual speakers/comments.
- Membership update 4th District was the first in the state to reach 97% renewal rate.
- Dr. Galati Dental Practice council meeting The Center for Professional Success will soon be available on the ADA website. Members will be allowed access to business information to help with their practices.
- Dr. Wetzel discussed the House of Delegates meeting: The cost of the House of Delegates meeting in NYC was discussed. A task force was formed to discuss relocation and Dr. Harrison was appointed to the group. A PGY-1 Task Force will study the development of a suitable portfolio-base examination as a part of the licensure process. This would be in addition to PGY-1 and is in response to concerns about limitations of PGY-1 outside of NY State. The Student Legistative Day was funded for 5 years to have students meet with leadership of the state dental association and legislature for one day.
- Dr. Gleason reported that the Foundation has helped 101 dentists affected by Hurricane Sandy.
- Schenectady County Dental Society voted at the May 15th meeting to change the governance to committee of 5 and they will reduce the number of meetings given during the year.
